GERMANY AUSTRIA AND SLOVAKIA DECIDED TODAY TO REINSTATE THEIR BORDER CONTROLS

TO STOP THE FLOW OF MIGRANT EXODUS

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USPA NEWS - Poland could reinstate border controls, as decided on September 14, Germany, followed by Austria and Slovakia "As soon as I receive any signal of danger for Poland will be restored without any delay, controls at Polish borders," said on Monday to the press the First Polish Minister Ewa Kopacz.

During this time, a summit meeting held that same Monday 14 September in Brussels where ministers of Interior and Justice of the 28 EU countries meet for an emergency meeting on migrants. This will involve defining the quotas for each country. Militaries of interventions are sent in Mediterranean to stop the smugglers, who make a fortune on the backs of migrants fleeing their country in war. According to the Hungarian police, Germany is no longer willing to accept that refugees flocking in Europe can "choose" the country that will host, warned Sunday, Interior Minister, Thomas de Maizière, the country has an unprecedented influx of migrants.

Asylum seekers must understand "that they can not choose the states where they seek protection," he told reporters as his country expects a record 800,000 asylum seekers this year. European rules, which require that asylum applications to be filed in the first country of entry to the European Union, "must continue to work," he added. The Vice Chancellor has German as he announced that Germany will soon absorb 1 million people refugees and the country reached a capacity limit has received. He explains that if Germany Star had to receive as many migrants it is because the EU has not managed to refreeze this problem.

Meanwhile, faced with the continuous influx of migrants on its territory from Hungary, Austria decided Thursday, September 10, to suspend its rail links with Budapest. The national airline Austrian Railways (ÖBB) has justified this decision by the "massive congestion" of its network because of the influx of migrants wishing to travel to Germany.

Approximately 800 additional Hungarian police is deployed as of Monday in the Serbian-Hungarian border, already reinforced by a barbed wire wall. Reuters announced that the Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban has installed 868 police in their functions.-----

"You will be confronted with people who have been deceived. You will be faced with anger and aggression," said he told the 868 police, asking them to act with humanity but to enforce the law" intransigently".

As of Tuesday, the new Hungarian legislation on migrants, which makes illegal immigration punishable by three years in prison, will be effective. Source: with Agencies
